Carving Supplies

- Power Tools
 - □ Foredom (for major wood grinding)
 - One of the following smaller units (NSK, Gesswin, Ram, etc.)
- Bits (typhoons, carbides, stump cutters, diamonds, rubies, stones, etc.)
 - □ Typhoons (1/4" Shank Cylinder ¾" and/or Ball Nose ¾" dia)
 - □ Typhoons (1/8" Shank Blue Cylinder ¼" dia, (optional Ball ¼", 3/8" dia, Taper ¼" dia))
 - □ Carbides Double spiral cut Tree Rounded End, Cylinder, Tree to Point
 - □ Diamonds/Rubies Ball 3/32, 1/16, Cylinder 1/16, Flames (straight & rounded tapers) 1/16, 1/8, Pointed taper
 - □ Green Stones (course) Cylinders straight or taper on the smaller size
 - □ White Stones Cylinders straight & taper on the smaller size, Flames small to large, etc.
 - □ Ceramic Sticks (blue and/or white)
- □ Woodburner & Tips (type of tip larger/small knife or similar, quill burner, scale burner (fish))
- □ Sanding material (sand paper, sanding mandrels, etc.)
- □ Wood Filler (Elmers wood filler, Quickwood, etc.)
- □ Synthetic Brush (if have, if not you can use mine)
- □ Calipers, Micrometer
- Dust Collector
